# 2024 CACTUS LEAGUE TEAMS SEASON RECAP

There are few events in the calendar year that are met with such heightened anticipation as the beginning of Major League Baseball's spring training season. Whether you're a celebratory Dodgers fan from Los Angeles still basking in the glow of a championship season, or a wait 'til next year Cleveland Guardians fan chomping at the bit for another chance, the countdown to the Cactus League season in Arizona begins right after the last pitch of the World Series.

Opening Day for the 2025 Cactus League Season is February 20th with the Los Angeles Dodgers beginning defense of the 2024 World Series title against the Chicago Cubs at Camelback Ranch in Glendale. A full slate of games is on the schedule for the next 33 days.

Five of the 15 Cactus League teams qualified for the post season in 2025 and hope always spring eternal in the spring for every team in the league.

Led by perennial MVP Award candidate, third baseman Jose Ramirez, the Cleveland Guardians sat in first place in the American League Central for just about every day of the 2024 season. The Guardians were closely followed by the upstart Wild-Card-winning Kansas City Royals, and the team's budding superstar shortstop Bobby Witt Jr. The Chicago White Sox set a dubious record for futility losing 121 games the most since Casey Stengel's "Amazin" 1962 NY Mets.



Four of the five teams in the AL West are members of Arizona's Cactus League and they all finished behind the division-leading Houston Astros. The Seattle Mariners fell one game short of qualifying the last AL Wild Card spot, just behind Kansas City and the Detroit Tigers. The defending World Series champion Texas Rangers were simply sub-par finishing in third place with a 78-84 record. In their last year in Oakland the A's avoided finishing in the cellar six games in front of the Los Angeles Angels.

The San Diego Padres made a late-season charge in the NL West finishing just five games behind the NL pennant and World Series champion Los Angels Dodgers. A loaded Dodgers squad with newly acquired Shohei Ohtani and Japanese countryman free-agent pitcher Yoshinobu Yamamoto as well as outfielder Mookie Betts and first baseman Freddie Freeman, proved to be an indomitable force. A well-balanced Padres squad figures to be back in the mix again in 2025. The defending National League champion Arizona Diamondbacks were also in the hunt in the NL West for most of the season but faded out of contention finishing in third place in front of the 4th place SF Giants and 5th place Colorado Rockies.


The most dominant team in the NL Central for the past decade, the Milwaukee Brewers have fished in first place in four of the past seven seasons. The Brewers burst out of the gate in 2024 moving into first place on April 13 and never looked back, until they were knocked out of the NL Wild Card series in dramatic fashion by the New York Mets on Pete Alonso's 9th inning grand slam in the decisive third game of the three-game series.

The long time Cactus League favorite Chicago Cubs finished just outside of the money, in second place with an 83-79 record. The Cincinnati Reds with perhaps baseball's most exciting player shortstop Elly De La Cruz did not play up to pre-season expectations finishing in fourth place with a 77-85 record. But with new manager Terry Francona at the helm the Reds exemplify the wait 'til next year of hope springing eternal in the spring.

It's that time of year again. Play ball!

# DIAMONDS IN THE DESERT



Scottsdale, sunshine and fresh-cut infields conjure up timeless scenes of spring training. But there is another rite in The West's Most Western Town where future all-stars hone their craft and champions are forged.

It's high school baseball. Pound for pound, Scottsdale area schools boast some of the finest programs in the country. From Orioles Hall of Fame pitcher Jim Palmer to this year's No. I pick of the Atlanta Braves Cam Caminiti, Scottsdale schools have produced 25 big leaguers as well as dozens of players drafted by the major league franchises and captured 35 state baseball titles.

This spring a free exhibit at Scottsdale's Little Red School House Museum celebrates that tradition with a fun and insightful look at the players, coaches and programs that have created a foundation of baseball excellence in the desert.

The exhibit is a joint effort between the nonprofit groups Arizona Baseball Legacy and Experience and the Scottsdale Historical Society. Tour the exhibit starting this January at the museum located at 7333 E. Scottsdale Mall in Scottsdale.

# THE HIGH COUNTRY OF FLAGSTAFF, WILLIAMS, TUSAYAN AND THE GATEWAY TO THE GRAND CANYON

While much of Arizona is defined by its desert regions and consistently high average temperatures it's decidedly different in Flagstaff (www.flagstaffarizona.org/) located northern Arizona's high-country mountain region where each of the four seasons remain evident. The average summer temperature hovers in the low 80s while winter snowfall averages more than 100" inches annually. The fall foliage is distinguished by a kaleidoscope of purple, red and orange hues. Spring brings the green blooming and flowering of the ponderosa pine forest. All of this combines to make Flagstaff an outdoor adventurists haven of hiking, biking mountain climbing, skiing, snowboarding and staring into the vast expanse of the cosmos at the Lowell Observatory (lowell.edu), where visitors can take guided tours and gaze through a specially equipped solar telescope to have a different perspective of the sun and stars.

You can still get your kicks driving through town on Route 66 and take pit stops at the town's seven craft breweries located within walking distance of each other.

Located just an hour south of the Grand Canyon, Williams, AZ (Visit Williams Arizona | Things To Do, Hotels, Route 66, Grand Canyon) is

known as the "Gateway to the Grand Canyon" most notably because of its Grand Canyon Railway, departing from Williams on the most scenic two-and-half-hour train ride in the country. Since 1901, the historic railway has transported passengers to the Southern Rim and of Grand Canyon and back in time to Arizona's western frontier days a decade before the territory was granted statehood in 1912. More than just ride along the rails, the luxurious journey offers an array of amenities including a dining car, observation car, gift shop and live music and cowboys in costume. Historic Route 66 runs right through Williams and history buffs can explore more than six blocks of historic buildings and shops bursting with memorabilia.

Just a mile from the Grand Canyon National Park's South Rim entrance, the town of Tusayan (pronounced Too-Say-Ann, Explore – Town of Tusayan) is an outdoor adventurers hidden paradise. Surrounded by the Kaibab National Forrest, Tusayan affords one the most diverse arrays of wildlife available in the state and the clearest views of the desert sky at night. The small town offers a variety of overnight lodgings and campgrounds.

# SURPRISE STADIUM



The surprising 2024 Kansas City Royals returned to the post season for the first time since the team's 2015 World Series championship season. After finishing in second place behind the AL Central division champion Cleveland Guardians, the Royals swept the Baltimore Orioles 2-0 in the AL Wild Card Series before falling to the New York Yankees, three-games-to-one in the American League Division Series.

The Royals will meet their respective roommate Texas Rangers for their 2025 Cactus League opener at Surprise Stadium on Friday February 21st. The 2023 defending World Series champion Rangers slipped into third place in the American League West in 2024.

The opening of Surprise Stadium (15850 N. Bullard Ave. Surprise AZ, 85374, 623 ·222 ·2222, www.surprisestadium.com) in 2003 blazed the trail for the Cactus League's growth and expansion into the West Valley, followed by the openings of Camelback Ranch in Glendale (2009), Goodyear Ballpark in Goodyear (2009), and the renovations and renaming of American Family Fields of Phoenix in Maryvale (2019).

Immediately establishing itself as the newest crown jewel of the Cactus League, Surprise Stadium continues to be among the league's most aesthetically pleasing and comfortable places to take in a game. Surprise Stadium is also home to the Surprise Saguaros of the Arizona Fall League (post season minor league/ instructional league) from early-October to mid-November.

Located on the Surprise Recreation Campus approximately 45 minutes from northwest of downtown Phoenix, the facility boasts 12 practice fields and pair of practice infields that surround Surprise Stadium's main field with a view of the White Tank Mountains serving as the backdrop.

The 10,500 seat capacity stadium includes a completely shaded upper-level seating area and grass berm outfield seating. The Michelob "Ultra" Legends Deck is an exclusive premium seating area on the 1st base line that offers fans the ultimate game day experience with club level tickets, a premium catered meal, drink voucher and private bar in an elevated seating section. Tickets per person start at \$50.

Because the two teams share the facility, there is a game scheduled to be played every day on the Cactus League schedule from February 21 - March 22. The Chicago Cubs will be in town for a pair of successive games against the Rangers and Royals on February 28 and March I. The Royals' AL Central division-rival Cleveland Guardians face KC at Surprise on

March 10 and 15. For those travelers that want to stay in the Surprise area, check out hotel and general visitor information at Explore Surprise.

## SALT RIVER FIELDS

After surprising everyone by reaching the 2023 World Series as a Wild Card team in the National League West, the plucky Arizona Diamondbacks fell back to third place and out of the post season in 2024, with a slightly better regular- season record than the year before.

Second baseman Ketel Marte reached career-highs with 36 home runs and 95 runs batted in and was elected to his second NLAII-Star team. Outfielder Corbin Carroll, the 2023 NL Rookie of Year, led the NL with 24 tripes, and hit 22 home runs with 74 RBI. Starting pitcher Zac Gallen anchored the D-Backs rotation posting a 14-6 record with a 3.65 ERA.

Still the first and only MLB facility built on Native American Land, Salt River Fields at Talking Stick (7555 N. Pima Rd. Scottsdale, 480.270.5000, www.saltriver-fields.com) is the shared spring training home and minor league operations head-quarters of the 2023 National League Champion Arizona Diamondbacks and Colorado Rockies since 2011.

Because two teams share the facility, there is a game being played just about every day on the Cactus League schedule From February 21 – March 25. The two teams' 12 practice fields are also open to the public from 9:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m.

The D-Backs open the Cactus League season with a pair of games against their co-tenant NL West rival Colorado Rockies on Friday, February 21, and Saturday February 22. The 2024 World Series champion Los Angeles Dodgers will play the Rockies at Salt River Fields on Thursday February, 27. The NL West division rival San Diego Padres are scheduled to square off against the Diamondbacks at SRF towards the end of the Cactus League season on Sunday, March 23.

The multi-purpose Salt River Fields facility hosts many other events large and small. From food and craft beer festivals and concerts to corporate functions and birthday parties, baseball clinics and camps and yoga classes on the outfield grass. Salt River Fields has something for all.





# GOODYEAR BALLPARK

Entering its 17th season as the spring training home of the Cincinnati Reds and Cleveland Guardians, Goodyear Ballpark (1933 S. Ballpark Way, Goodyear, 623.882.3120, www.goodyearbp.com) brought Cactus League baseball to Phoenix bourgeoning west-side in 2008 and the surrounding community has continued to boom ever since.

Because two teams share the facility, there is a game being played just about every day on the Cactus League schedule From February 22 – March 23.

The 2024 Guardians burst out of the blocks and never looked back, occupying first place in the AL Central every day of the season after April 1, outdistancing the second place Kansas City Royals by 6.5 games. The Guardians defeated the Wild Card Series winning Detroit Tigers three-games-to-two in a hard-fought American League Division Series but came up short against the New York Yankees in the American League Championship Series.

The Reds flirted with post-season contention until early June but faded in the second half. Sophomore sensation Elly De La Cruz continued to establish himself as one of the games up and coming stars, knocking 25 home runs with 76 RBI while leading the National League with 67 stolen bases.


The Guardians and Reds are scheduled to open the 2025 Cactus League season facing each other at Goodyear Ballpark on Saturday February 22.

Other standout games on the schedule include: the World Series champion Los Angeles Dodgers vs. the Reds on Monday, February 24. The NL West Wild Card winning San Diego Padres face the Reds on Monday March 1. The Guardians will host the NL Central champion Milwaukee Brewers on Sunday, March 2, and Milwaukee will be right back to play their NL Central Division rival Reds the next day on March 3. The Chicago Cubs and Guardians will stage a 2016 World Series rematch at Goodyear Ballpark on Monday, March 10.

Seasoned veteran manager and former Cleveland skipper, Terry Francona was hired as the Reds new manager for 2025.

Designed by the renowned ballpark architectural firm of HOK Sport of Kansas City, the complex includes an 8,000-seat ballpark stadium with a 1,500 outfield-lawn seating capacity, six luxury suites, terrace seating on the third level behind home plate and a 300-seat right field pavilion. The state-of-the-art training facility also serves as the year-round player development complex for both the Reds and Guardians.

A signature design element of the ballpark is a piece of modern fiberglass sculpture called "The Ziz" fabricated by internationally famous artist Donald Lipski. "The Ziz serves as a gathering place for fans in front of the ballpark's main home plate entrance and was named one of the "Best Public Art Projects in the U.S." by Americans for the Arts.







# COCHISE COUNTY, SIERRA VISTA, WILCOX AND WINE COUNTRY

Located in the southeastern corner of the state of Arizona, 15 miles from the border of Mexico and 15 miles southwest of Tombstone, Sierra Vista, (Spanish for 'mountain view') is the commercial, cultural and recreational hub of Cochise County. There's so much to see and do in Sierra Vista that you might want to make more than a day trip of it.

On a par with the Grand Canyon or any of Arizona's amazing natural wonders, the Chiricahua National Monument (Chiricahua National Monument Website) is the historic haunted homeland and refuge of Cochise and the Chiricahua Apache. Standing among the stacked rock formations makes one ponder life's larger issues like geologic time and man's place in the universe


Moving in the opposite direction below the surface, Kartchner Caverns State Park (Kartchner Caverns State Park | Arizona) is an underworld wonderland of a massive cave discovered by two college students in 1978 which they kept secret until approaching the Arizona State Parks office in 1984 and opened to the public as a State Park in 1999. The Ro-

tunda—Throne Room cave tour is available all year around; the Big Room is only available from October 15 to April 15, as it serves as a nursery roost for bats during the summer.

Rich soil, high elevation, cool nights and warm days have created ideal climactic conditions in Arizona's wine country encompassing the towns of Sonoita, Patagonia, and Wilcox (VisitWillcox). The region has become popular destination among oenophiles who plan their trips around visiting the many wineries and tasting rooms.

Other area attractions in Wilcox include the Amerind Museum, Fort Bowie and the Rex Allen Museum.





## THE MID-STATE PINAL COUNTY REGION

Just below Maricopa County and the city of Phoenix and just above Pima County and the city of Tucson, Pinal County encompasses 5,374 sprawling square miles of beautiful desert tundra and two distinct geographical regions ranging from its western low valleys to eastern mountains soaring to an elevation of 6,000 feet.

Visitors to Pinal County will find access to numerous State Parks, Wilderness areas, National Monuments, National Forests, wide-open spaces and approximately 60 miles of regional non-motorized multi-use trails, including a National Scenic Trail. Designated as a National Scenic Trail in 2009, The Arizona Trail (ANST) stretches for more than 800 miles of multi-use, non-motorized cross-state terrain running from the Mexican border to the Utah state line.

Originally created as a means of providing a reliable supply of water from the Colorado River, the Central Arizona Project (CAP) canal system is also a long-distance, non-motorized, muti-use trail corridor that was devised before the canal was built. In accordance with federal regulations protecting native fish, wildlife and plants, constructed along the full-length of the 336-mile canal, the second longest trail in Arizona, exceeded only by the Arizona National Scenic Trail.

Other Pinal County trails include, The Lost Goldmine Trail running along the foothills of the Superstition Mountains and the Pinal County Birding Trail featuring the state's most abundant bird watching opportunities containing 422 different species. The trail and all trailheads are open from 5 am to 10 pm. For more information visit: Explore | Pinal County, AZ

Cactus League baseball history buffs and long-time San Francisco Giants might be familiar with Casa Grande (Home - Experience Casa Grande Discover Casa Grande: Arizona's Hidden Gem for Adventure) and the Francisco Grande Hotel & Golf Resort (Hotel - Francisco Grande Hotel and Golf Resort) as the former spring training compound of the Giants from 1961-1984. Located not quite equidistant but somewhere in be-

tween Phoenix and Tucson, Casa Grande and the nearby Casa Grande Ruins (Casa Grande Ruins National Monument (U.S. National Park Service), sit at the state's geographic and ancient crossroads. The ancestral home of the Hohokam Sonoran Desert people, the original farming community and "Great House" are preserved at the Casa Grande Ruins National Monument. Casa Grande's rich cultural heritage is also preserved and celebrated through various cultural events, festivals, and art exhibitions that showcase traditional crafts, music, dance, and culinary delights.

The Francisco Grande hotel's large baseball bat shaped pool and accompanying round (ball shaped) Jacuzzi historic serve as a reminder of the resort's original connection to Arizona's Cactus League spring training circuit. The nearby Rooster Cogburn Cattle Ranch was formerly owned by actor John Wayne who also kept a penthouse suite, which is still available at the hotel. Francisco Grande still serves as a premium sports resort for athletes to train, play, rest, 16 Major League Soccer teams and 5 international National teams have trained at the facility.




